11 <sup>th</sup> February	Martyrdom Day of Maqbool Butt Shaheed. He was hanged in Tahar Jail (New Delhi) in 1984.
11 March	Death anniversary Kashmiri leader and former President of Azad Jammu Kashmir Khursheed
	Hassan Khursheed. He was died in a road accident on March 11, 1988, while travelling in a public
	transport vehicle as an ordinary passenger. He is buried in the heart of Muzaffarabad.

	peaceful gathering of Kashmiri Muslims in Srinagar. Twenty two people have embraced	
	martyrdom, many were injured.	
19 July Yum - Illhaq -e- Pakistan (Accession to Pakistan Day),In 1947, All Jammu and		
	Conference passed a resolution in a meeting, demanding Mahraja that Kashmiris want to accede	
	with Pakistan and Mahraja should keep in mind the wishes of Kashmiris.	
31 July	Death anniversary of Prominent leader of Kashmir Freedom Struggle of 1947 and founder	
	President of Azad Kashmir Ghazi Millat Sardar Muhammad Ibraheem Khan.He was died on 31st

	victim Noora (24) was forcefully dragged out of her kitchen by 20 men from the CRPF

Passenger Bus ablaze: 11	On 11 September 1990, a civil passenger bus in Kashmir was intercepted and fired upon			
September 1990	which resulted in the death of 22 civilians. Thereafter, the bus was set on fire which			
	resulted in the burning of eight persons alive.			
	OCTOBER			
Doda Mass Rapes: October	A fifty year old resident of the village Ludna in Doda district told Human Rights Watch			
5, 1998	that on October 5, 1998 the Eighth Rashtriya Rifles came to her house, took her and beat			
	her. She was then raped by a captain who was a Hindu and said to her: "You are			
	Muslims, and you will all be treated like this."			
Chak Saidpora Mass Rape:	On October 10, 1992, an army unit of the 22 <sup>nd</sup> Grenadiers entered the village of Chak			
October 10, 1992	Saidapora. Several army soldiers gang-raped more than nine women, including an 11-			
	year-old girl and a 60-year-old woman			
Bijbehara Massacre:	The Bijbehara Massacre refers to an incident that took place between protesters and the			
October 22, 1993	74 <sup>th</sup> Battalion Border Security Force (BSF) in the Occupied Jammu & Kashmir on			
	October 22, 1993. The BSF was accused of arbitrarily firing on a crowd and killing 51			
	civilians in Bijbehara after protests erupted over the siege of the mosque in Hazratbal.
